League of Women Voters Releases 2023 Legislative Scorecard Regular Session for 25 Key Bills

Morgantown, WV: The League of Women Voters of West Virginia (LWVWV) today announced the release of a new Legislative Scorecard, which tracks the votes of WV state senators and delegates on legislation that became law from the 2023 regular session. The Scorecard was designed to offer voters easy-to-use information on how their legislators voted on bills prioritized by LWVWV.

This is information designed to inform voters and to hold legislators, regardless of party, accountable for their votes on League priorities.

"This Scorecard offers a new way for voters to know whether their legislators are being responsive to their interests," says Julie Archer, President of LWVWV. "LWVWV wants voters to be well informed. It is part of our mission to serve voters in a nonpartisan way."

The 2023 regular session of the WV Legislature resulted in 333 bills becoming law, too many for anyone to consume easily and not all of equal importance. The LWVWV Legislative Scorecard includes 25 bills covering four League priorities: strengthening democracy by making voting easier, safeguarding equal rights, protecting children and families, and creating a sustainable future.
